
# BREAKING THE LOGJAM A BLUEPRINT FOR PROGRESS ON SCHOOL SAFETY

#### Goal

To provide a forum for identifying barriers to implementing previous reports, recommendations and initiatives aimed at school safety, anti-racism and organizational/systemic change. To develop strategies for ensuring implementation of past and future reports, recommendations and initiatives and to synthesize this information for production in the final report and recommendations of the School Community Safety and Advisory Panel (SCSAP).
